Franklin's Walking School Bus - Every Wednesday Morning and Afternoon

Do you live in or around Laurel Pl, Banksia Crst, Forest St, Lambie St, Gadara Pl or Simpson St? Do your children walk to and home from school? Why not jump on Franklin's Walking School Bus!

A walking school bus is aimed at K-Year 3 kids (but all students are welcome) who walk to and from school along a safe and enjoyable set route. There is also a bus driver and conductor, one 'drives' the bus from the front while the conductor supervises from behind. Extra parents are more that welcome to come along for the ride and the walking bus will pick children up along the way, and after school, drops them off on the designated walk back.

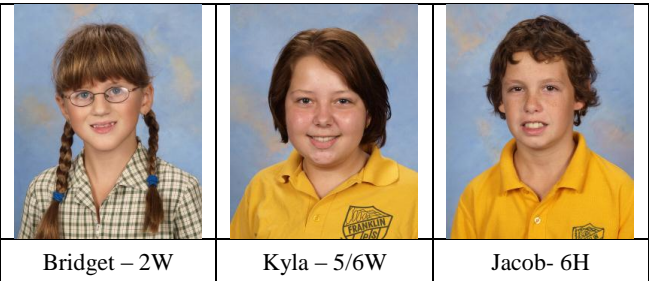
