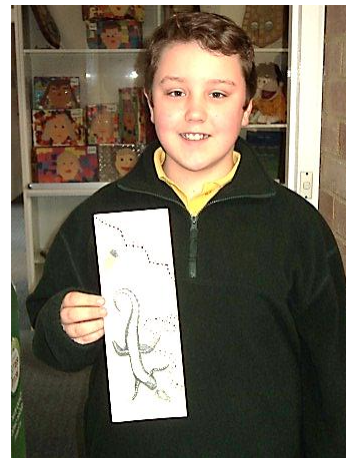
CHILDREN'S ART EXHIBITION

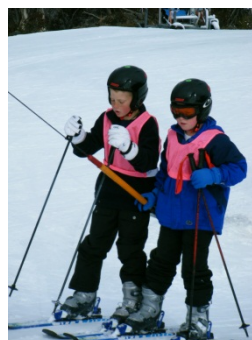
NAIDOC BANNER

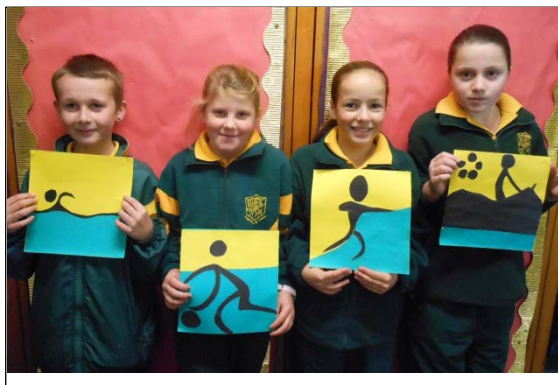
