Do you have an Aboriginal hero? Have you heard of these – Noel Pearson, Sally Morgan, Tony Mundine, Bronwyn Bancroft, Lowitja O'Donohue, Aiden Ridgeway, Archie Roach, Geoffrey Yunupingu and Mandaway Yunupingu? These are Aboriginal hero's that 4/5R were introduced to last week. We looked at Geoffrey Yunupingu and listened to his brilliant music. We also looked at the life and work of Mandaway Yunupingu who was the lead singer of Yothu Yindi. The whole of Australia was saddened by the loss of this great man. His memorial ceremony was screened on ABC's Australian Story because his family gave permission for it to be aired so that his work for indigenous Australians can continue. Mandaway was Australia's first indigenous School Principal and education was his whole vision. The song 'Treaty' was sung in part Aboriginal and it took Aboriginal language to the international stage.

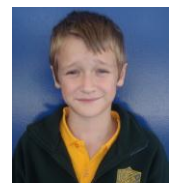
