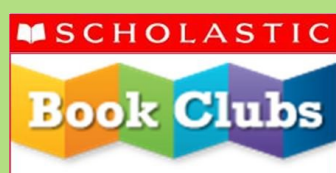

Sturt in Action

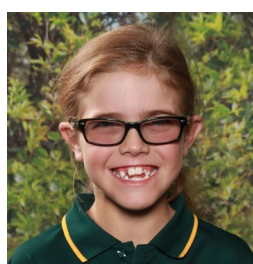

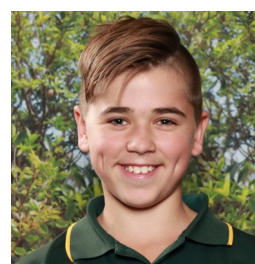
