P&C Raffles


Franklin P&C are holding **two raffles** as their Xmas Fundraiser this year.

National Science Day

Throughout Friday we went to 4 different classes and participated in different Science experiments. This Science Report was compiled by **Beau Rossiter** and **Will Turner** from Oxley.



Beau: The class I started at was Miss Rampling's class. We made DIY lava lamps by using a half full water bottle, cooking oil, Hydralyte tablets and food colouring. We tested what glitter would dissolve. The reaction with the water and the Hydralyte tablet was that the water started to bubble and make the water fizz.

Mr Crane: We created little figures from plastic cubes, and then we built a cocoon to protect our figures. They were given a drop test from head height and those that survived won! From our class, only Cordell and my figures managed to survive the test. Gravity sure pulled us down.



Will: Ms Ingold was hosting 'what group could build the strongest tower' There were marshmallows, playdough ,tape and blue tack, you had a lot of sticks of uncooked pasta. I was on the marshmallow and we got the second strongest tower. It managed to survive a severe earthquake!

Mr Woodward had 4 learning stations: the first 1 was that you had to fill up a zip lock bag up with water and poked pencils through it and you had to try to get as many as you can. The second station was you had to create a vortex with a bottle of water and the water had glitter inside it. There was a station in which we painted with 'invisible ink. The final station used a glass plate and a whiteboard marker to create a floating drawing.
